Finding God's Will Proverbs 3:5-6

Introduction:

A. Familiar Verses

- 1. Years ago Kellogg's had an advertisement for Corn Flakes that showed a bowl of old fashioned Corn Flakes, the kind we ate years and years ago, and the ad said, "Corn Flakes, taste them again for the first time."
- 2. Sometimes we get used to certain texts in the Bible and they're kind of like Corn Flakes.
 - a) We've heard these over and over again.
 - b) The memory verses for last week and this week are like that.
 - c) If we were in a testimony meeting and asked people to share favorite verses, somebody would stand and say these verses because they are ones that we all love.
 - d) Proverbs 3:5-6 turn to them and taste them again for the first time!
 - ⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding.
 - ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

B. The Good News!

- 1. The question that is most often asked by Christians is, "How can I find God's purpose/will for my life?"
- 2. But here's the good news.
 - a) Our text tells us, and many other texts tell us, that God will guide us in His will.
 - b) Would you like to have the assurance that God is guiding your life?
- 3. Isaiah 58:11 (ESV)
 - ¹¹ And the LORD will guide you continually and satisfy your desire in scorched places and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail.
 - a) Now, isn't that awesome?
 - b) Not off and on, not haphazardly "the LORD will guide you continually..."
- 4. Psalm 32:8 (NKJV)
 - ⁸ I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will guide you with My eye.
 - a) Are you close enough to the Lord He can guide you with His eye?
 - b) God promised to do that!

C. God's Workmanship - Ephesians 2:10.

- ¹⁰ For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.
- 1. Workmanship = poiema = literally means we're His poem, we're His work of art.
 - a) Before He saved us, God had a wonderful purpose for our lives.
 - b) There's a Father above us who's directing all things.
 - c) There's the Savior beside us guiding our footsteps.
 - d) There is the Holy Spirit within us directing our hearts.
 - e) We have a God who will guide us.
- 2. Psalm 37:23: "The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord..."
 - a) The steps—step by step—our heavenly Father wants to guide us and lead us.
 - b) And He has a plan and a purpose for each one of us.
 - c) I am where God wants me.
 - d) And if you're in a business, if you're in a job, if you're in school, whatever you're doing, if you are in the will of God, there is no higher calling or place than being in the will of God.
- 3. Let's look at four steps, that come out of our memory verses.
- 4. They help us to find, to follow, and to finish God's will for our life.

I. Let God Choose the Way - v. 5

A. Trust the Lord - v. 5a

- ⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding.
- ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.
- 1. In order to let God choose the way, you've got to have confidence in God because we're not told to trust a proposition.
 - a) This is not a script or a formula.

- b) You have to have a vital connectivity with God Himself.
- 2. "Trust in the Lord..."
 - a) In the Lord, a person who is totally trustworthy.
- 3. You can't trust somebody that you don't know and you don't love.
 - a) You can know them and still not trust them.
 - b) As a matter of fact, that might be the reason you don't trust them because you know them.
 - c) But if you really love a person, then you trust them.
- 4. For example, if Betty said to me, "Dan'l, close your eyes and open your mouth," then I would do it!
 - a) She would take something wonderful that she has created that is delicious and probably chocolate.
 - b) If a perfect stranger told me, "Shut your eyes and open your mouth," there is no way I would do it because I don't know them.
 - c) I love Betty and she loves me, and I know that she loves me so much she would never willingly harm or embarrass or hurt me in any way.
 - d) You cannot trust someone you do not love and you cannot love someone you do not know.
 - e) And you cannot know someone you don't spend time with.
 - f) The reason many people do not know God's will for their lives is they do not love Him because they don't trust Him because they do not know Him.
 - g) We're to trust in the Lord with all of our heart.
 - h) To know Him is to love Him.
 - i) To love Him is to trust Him.
 - j) To trust Him is to obey Him.
 - k) To obey Him is to be blessed.

B. "... lean not to your own understanding." - v. 5b

- 1. One of the hardest things for us to do is to set aside our own personal wisdom and to stop trusting in it.
 - a) Proverbs 3:7, says, "Be not wise in your own eyes..."
 - b) Most of us are wise in our own eyes.
- 2. Proverbs 14:12 "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death."
 - a) You can be wise in your own eyes, and it can seem right to you.
 - b) That's where we get in trouble sometimes because we trust our own wisdom and human ingenuity rather than trusting in the Lord.
- 3. Jeremiah 10:23 "I know, O LORD, that the way of man is not in himself, that it is not in man who walks to direct his steps."
 - a) Jeremiah is saying don't trust your own understanding.
 - b) Lay your pride in the dust and say, "God, I don't have what I need," and don't be afraid to let God choose the way.
- 4. Are you willing?
 - a) Are you really willing to let God choose the way?
 - b) "In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will direct your paths."

C. Noah Trusted God

- And Noah acknowledged God in all his ways and did not lean on his own understanding and God directed his paths.
- 2. Someone wrote: All I will ever need to know I learned from Noah.
 - a) Don't miss the boat.
 - b) Remember that we are all in the same boat.
 - c) Plan ahead. It wasn't raining when Noah built the Ark.
 - d) Stay fit. When you're 600 years old someone may ask you to do something really big.
 - e) Don't listen to critics, just get on with the job that needs to be done.
 - f) Build your future on high ground.
 - g) Speed isn't everything. The snails were on board with the cheetahs.
 - h) When you're stressed, float awhile.
 - i) Remember the Ark was built by amateurs, the Titanic by professionals.
 - j) No matter what the storm, when you are with God there's always a rainbow waiting.
- 3. Noah was a man who trusted God.
 - a) What did God do for him and his family?
 - b) God saved Noah and his family from certain destruction.
